




Getting it just right

Routes of significance


From start to finish, we can plan a suitable route that may include current and former family homes, local neighbourhoods, sports club, places of work, favourite spots, landmarks even "The Local".

Some of these ideas can also generate funeral favours for handing out to mourners such as: a packet of seeds, collection of favourite sweets, books from their library or other keepsakes.







Digital tributes



Ashes

Ashes can be stored in urns or caskets. These can be used as objet d'art or for interment at a later date. Caskets can be from the same material as the coffin and most are bio-degradable. We have a wide variety of styles, materials and designs to choose from.

Scatter tubes also come in a range of designs and styles as well as sizes enabling families to easily disperse the ashes. For those that want to go out with a bang, we can arrange for fireworks displays, at-sea scattering, or dispersal with a difference.






Keep a memento




